GOVERNMENT'S ISSUANCE CALENDAR FOR OCTOBER TO DECEMBER 2024

In accordance with Government's effort to develop the domestic capital market and improve transparency in the issuance of Government treasury bills, we forward the attached issuance calendar for publication.

2. The Calendar is developed based on the 2024 domestic maturities for the period and the Net Domestic Financing (NDF) from the 2024 Mid-Year Fiscal Policy Review. It describes the securities that are intended to be issued in respect of Government's Public Sector Borrowing Requirement for the period October to December 2024.

3. As Government completes the Eurobond Debt restructuring programme, and currently focusing on the commercial debt restructuring, Government's financing from the domestic market will be the issuance of only Treasury Bills in line with the IMF program. In this regard, Government plans to issue a gross amount of **GH¢64,476.01 million** for the period, October to December, 2024 of which **GH¢53,646.30 million** is to rollover short term maturities and the remaining **GH¢10,829.70 million** is fresh issuance to meet Government's financing requirements.

4. Please note that the stated gross borrowing amount is indicative to guide the market and may be revised when transaction adverts are published. Government may update the issuance calendar on a rolling monthly basis, to reflect a full quarter financing programme.

5. Accordingly, Government aims to meet its financing needs through the issuance of Treasury Bills as detailed below:

- i. 91-day, 182-day and 364-day bills will be issued weekly; and
- ii. This will be done through the primary auction with settlement being the transaction date plus one business day.

6. Government expects that this October to December 2024 calendar meets the requirements of market participants.

7. Government assures all stakeholders and the public, that it will continue to strive for greater predictability and transparency in the domestic capital market.
